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

n 2012, Josh Rice proposed a crazy idea to Pilar McKay. That crazy idea has evolved from an itinerant company performing one weekend of shows in one location at the underutilized Perry Public Beach, to a seasonal not-for-profit that produces over 40 shows across 10 counties of Western New York, a revitalized Public Beach, a home space in an abandoned storefront-turned

theatre on Main Street in Perry, an international puppet festival, renowned education programs, and more. This exhibition at the Arts Council for Wyoming County celebrates 10 years of fast, fun, and physical theatre and performing arts in Perry, NY, showing the potential and success of creative placemaking—that play makes place.



#### **Kayfabe**

**KAYFABE** is an absurdist wrestling puppet show, but it is also the term used in professional wrestling to describe the presentation of staged performances/wrestling matches as genuine or authentic. Philosopher and critic Roland Barthes wrote in Mythologies, "The function of the wrestler is not to win; it is to go exactly through the motions that are expected of him." Inspired by Barthes and Samuel Beckett, this piece explores fantasy, reality, and the spaces in-between, using puppetry and the very real sport of professional wrestling.



Puppetry Credits: Dan Hurlin's Demolishing Everything with Amazing Speed (Bard SummerScape, Holland Festival); Shank's Mare (Chicago Int't Puppet Festival, La MaMa, Japan tour, Hawaii tour, U.S. tour); Petrushka with the NY Philharmonic Orchestra (The Barbican) and the Oregon Symphony Orchestra (Portland); The Scarlet Ibis (HERE Arts Center): Packrat (La MaMa) and his own work, The Marooned at Dixon Place and New York State Puppet Festival 2018; The VaudeVillains and Composite Portrait at La MaMa; The Tempest, directed at Shake on the Lake and Sarah Lawrence College. Chad has served as a Guest Artist and Director for the University of Central Arkansas, Bradley University in Illinois, and the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. Chad also has teaching experience at universities like Penn State, Hendrix College, and the University of Central Arkansas. Chad is a recipient of National Art Strategies' Creative Community Fellowship and founded Voices Uncaged (www.voicesuncaged.org), a program that, along with the support of Shake on the Lake, has been dedicated to bringing theatre arts and education into prisons for the last 5 years.

BODIES OF WATER, the devised piece that was part of a collaborative virtual project between Seattle University, University of Washington, and Cornish College of the Arts called UNCHARTED WATERS. This is their third official summer season with Shake on the Lake, having previously been a part of 2018's RICHARD III and 2019's AS YOU LIKE IT. You may also have seen them working behind-the-scenes at SOTL's 2019 production of A CHRISTMAS CAROL. They earned their Associate's Degree in Theatre Technology from Genesee Community College in December 2019, and are currently pursuing their BFA in Performance Production at Cornish College of the Arts.



\* SETH HEBERT-FAERGOLZIA is a singer-songwriter, composer, artist and puppeteer living in Rochester, New York.

Faergolzia is best known

as the frontrunner of Dufus, a music project that landed in New York City's antifolk scene during the late 1990s. Known for their wild concerts packed with unforgettable songs and punk-rock gymnastics, Dufus gained a devoted cult following worldwide, especially in Germany and Switzerland, sharing stages along the way with dozens of high-profile artists including Animal Collective, Regina Spektor, Jeffrey Lewis, the Moldy Peaches and the Yeah Yeah Yeahs.

In 2010, after relocating to Rochester, New York, Faergolzia dissolved Dufus and formed the 23 Psaegz, a new ensemble to realize his magnum opus, MOON SHAPED HEAD GIRL. The imaginative musical style of the Psaegz, along with their revolving-door membership, quickly established Faergolzia as a central figure in Rochester's underground music communities.

In 2015, the 23 Psaegz distilled to a smaller, more singular group known as Multibird. Since forming, this quartet has toured relentlessly, often visiting continental Europe two to three times per year.

Now, with live concerts still on hold, Faergolzia and his team are focused in earnest on completing MOON SHAPED HEAD GIRL.



\* SARAH KEELER is a movement teacher, dancer and writer based in Perry, NY. She is the founder of Genesee Dance Theatre, a dance company and training program that brings

professional dance experiences to rural communities. Sarah has performed with dance companies, theatres and theme parks across the country including In-Sight Dance Company (NYC), Broadway Texas! (Austin) and SeaWorld San Antonio. A graduate of North East School of the Arts and Marymount Manhattan College, Sarah also trained at the Ballet San Antonio Academy, The Ailey School and Broadway Dance Center. Before relocating to Perry, Sarah was on faculty at the Neglia Conservatory of Ballet and the Buffalo City Summer School for the Arts. 
